STUDENTS WILL APPLY THEIR EXPANDED AND DEEPENED KNOWLEDGE OF LITERACY AND LITERACY PRACTICES LEARNED FROM AFRICAN AMERICAN RHETORIC AND COMPOSITION SCHOLARSHIP TO THEIR PROJECTS AND CONSIDER THEIR DEEPENED UNDERSTANDING OF LITERACY WHEN PROVIDING FEEDBACK ON YOUR PEERS' WORK. ALONG WITH THIS, STUDENTS WILL BE INVITED TO CONSIDER HOW LESSONS LEARNED FROM AFRICAN AMERICAN RHETORIC AND COMPOSITION CAN BE USED FOR PROGRESS AND PROSPERITY AND TO WRITE REALITIES THEY WANT TO EXPERIENCE INTO EXISTENCE.
